Dear Peachtree Road Friends,

Our theme for the season of Lent has been “Life-Changing Encounters with Jesus.” During these 40 days, we have been reflecting upon persons who have had their lives changed as a result of meeting Jesus: Nicodemus, the Samaritan woman who came to draw water at Jacob’s well, a man who had been blind since birth, Lazarus who was raised from the dead, the crowd who welcomed him into Jerusalem, and the disciples who ate a final meal with him. When we meet Jesus, let our guard down, and allow his spirit to penetrate deep into our souls, we are changed. I hope your relationship with Christ has grown deeper in this Lenten season.

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb.
